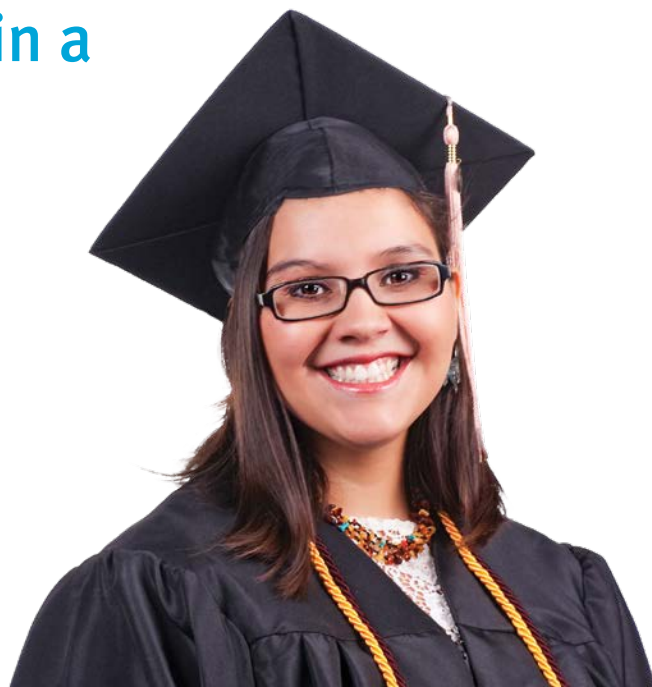

You can choose to further customize your degree by focusing electives on a particular area of study, such as nutrition or health science.

You can also choose to complete an **accelerated master's degree option**, which allows you to work toward your bachelor's degree while simultaneously completing up to five core courses in a School of Health Sciences master's degree program. Choose from master's degrees in health care administration, health informatics, health information management, public health, and health education. If you successfully complete these courses with a minimum course

grade, and have applied and been accepted to the applicable Kaplan University master's degree program, you will enter a shortened version of the master's degree program.

- Gaining an understanding of demography, epidemiology, biostatistics, and other tools used to assess community health
- Understanding and applying the concepts of health, healing, and wellness from a broad historical and multicultural perspective
