- › Assistant Clinical Manager—Help establish and implement policies, objectives, and procedures for a department. Aid the top manager in evaluating personnel and work quality. Develop reports and budgets. Coordinate activities with other managers.
- › Medical Records Administrator—Help establish and implement policies, objectives, and procedures for a department. Handle budget and staffing matters.

Customize Your Degree to Prepare for the Career You Want.

Students enrolled in Kaplan University's **Bachelor of Science in Health Care Administration** program have the opportunity to develop knowledge in core health care administration topics from a comprehensive curriculum taught by working practitioners. You can choose to further customize your degree by focusing electives on a particular area of study, such as nutrition or health science.

You can also choose to complete an **accelerated master's degree option**, which allows you to work toward your bachelor's degree while simultaneously completing up to five core courses in a School of Health Sciences master's degree program. Choose from master's degrees in health care administration, health informatics, health information management, public health, and health education. If you successfully complete these courses with a minimum course grade, and have applied and been accepted to the applicable Kaplan University master's degree program, you will enter a shortened version of the master's degree program.

- › Demonstration of sound foundational knowledge and understanding of principles and practice in health care regarding administration, management, law, economics, and policy
- › Demonstration of competency in industry-specific knowledge and skills related to research methods, critical thinking, and problem solving in health care settings
- › Application of the principles of management needed to work in teams, build cross-functional teams, and facilitate collaborative decision-making
- › Application of best practices in decision making within the functional areas of health care management
- › Understanding of the forces impacting health delivery systems and the effective and efficient management of health care
