Possible Career Opportunities and Day-to-Day Activities:¹

- › **Health Educator**—Attempt to prevent illnesses by informing and educating individuals and communities about health-related topics. Assess audience needs and design and implement an educational program to meet those needs. Serve as a resource on health topics.
- › **Epidemiologist**—Conduct research in an effort to eradicate or control infectious diseases. Collaborate with physicians to find ways to contain outbreaks of diseases. Develop standards and guidelines for the treatment and control of communicable diseases.
- › **Health Services Manager**—Oversee the activities of a number of facilities in health systems. Help formulate business strategies and coordinate day-to-day business in a health care facility.
